Outlining the programmes

Reach

Five emerging UK-based disabled writers developing the script for their first full-length show over 4 months

Pay of £1,000 for participation in the programme, plus an additional £600 for writer-performers / £100 for writers to attend a half day discussion with Nickie and performers and the sharing

- Led by Nickie Miles-Wildin
- Peer-facilitated writing groups and 1:1 dramaturgical support
- Three residencies - a 1-day introductory residential at the start of the programme, a 5-day midpoint writing residential and a 5-day endpoint sharing residential
- Ideas that are open to change and growth over the programme
- No previous or ongoing development or performance support on this piece

Launchpad

Four UK-based disabled theatre makers or small disabled-led companies (max. three people) developing an existing work-in-progress piece for a showcase in September 2026

Pay of £1,150 for the development, plus an additional £1,075 for those performing at the showcase

- Led by Debbie Hannan and Jamie Hale
- Online development sessions, workshops, industry mentors, 1:1 dramaturgy, group writing sessions, writing residential and public showcase
- Work not previously staged
- Your first or second major showcasing opportunity
- Performances brought together into a showcase, sharing a fully realised 20-minute excerpt
- Boosting disabled creatives to the next stage in their careers

Breakthrough

A commission for a disabled UK-based creative or company who's ready to break into the mainstream - and facing disabling barriers

£6,000 commission and further £1,500 to pay for six sessions with an industry mentor of their choice

- Led by Jamie Hale
- Create a small, very high quality professional sample of your work - a calling card to showcase your potential
- Mentoring and development budget, with support from the CRIPTic team
- For people with an extensive track record who have struggled to break into the mainstream

What can you create when you're not creating on a shoestring?

Incubate

Incubate is a leadership programme for four UK-based disabled emerging cultural leaders or organisational leaders/coordinators in the cultural sector

Free to attend - CRIPtic will cover access costs associated with joining the programme

- Led by Jamie Hale
- 12 peer learning sessions where participants will share their own expertise and develop as a cohort
- Cultural leaders and influencers and people establishing, leading or co-ordinating organisations
- Topics from finances and impact to social media and marketing
- Direction and strategy for individual or organisational growth and impact

What makes an application exceptional?



- Don't worry about neuronormativity - we're interested in your ideas - not your structure, spelling, and grammar
- Show us what makes your idea different from what's already out there
- Explain why **you** want, need and are in the right place for **this opportunity at this point in your career**
- Read the call-out and brief - and make sure you're addressing the things we want to know

An exceptional Reach application shows:

- A strong sense of tone, voice and character in the way that you write and the sample you share
- An original idea - we're particularly interested in work by disabled writers that isn't about personal experience and narratives
- An understanding of the story you're telling, how you want it told, and the type of venues and opportunities you think it fits in
- Why you're applying, and how you think the Reach programme will help you grow and develop

Reach supports five emerging UK-based disabled writers developing the script for their first full-length show over four months

An exceptional Launchpad application:

- Shows work in an artform suitable for live performance or sharing on a stage
- Has an idea that feels new, fresh and original - or a refreshing take on something we've encountered before in a different form
- Is about a piece that is clearly understandable, explainable, and marketable, both for this showcase, and in future development
- Shows that your work has been developed to a considerable degree, while remaining open and flexible
- Demonstrates readiness for a professional staging and clearly explains how this opportunity fits into your creative journey

Launchpad supports four UK-based disabled creatives or small companies developing an existing WIP piece for a showcase in September 2026

An exceptional Breakthrough application

- Is for a self-contained project - we're not funding part of a larger project
- Is using the full budget to create something small but refined - of an incredibly high quality to act as an independent 'calling card' to the industry
- Shows that you've achieved considerable success - and are ready to break into the mainstream
- Relates this specific commission & CRIPtic's support to the barriers that are preventing you breaking into the mainstream, and shows how this could provoke the change you're ready for

Breakthrough is a commission for a disabled UK-based creative or company who's ready to break into the mainstream

An exceptional Incubate application

- Explores yourself as a leader, and the idea you're developing
- Demonstrates clear knowledge of the sector, the niche you're working in, and how the work you're doing is going to make change
- Engages with the topics covered and explores how they would help you or your organisation grow, develop, and level up
- Explores what you'd bring, give and share in the sessions, and where your expertise could support the other leaders and organisations

Incubate is a leadership development programme for four disabled people creating cultural change in the arts.

Successes of previous artists

- Part of Incubate in 2022, Sam Brewer and Flawbored toured internationally with their show, *It's a Motherf**king Pleasure*
- Jacqui Adeniji-Williams was a Launchpad artist in 2021, and a Breakthrough artist in 2023 - she's since released her independent EP, *Notes to Self*
- Terri Jade Donovan developed *DOG DOG DOG* as part of Reach 2023 - last year, they won a Special Commendation from the Bruntwood Prize for the play
- Following being part of Launchpad 2025, *Apolune: Systems Normal* by Peyvand Sadeghian & Matthew Robinson opened at APT Gallery in early 2026
- After being part of Reach in 2024, Britny Virginia had her film *Dancing Shoes* screened nationally

Who are we looking for

- CRIPtic's work is for disabled people - by which we mean “people who face disableist [including audist] barriers”, or “people who identify themselves as deaf or disabled – or are identified by others as deaf or disabled in society” - and disabled-led projects (where at least 50% of the group are disabled)
- Reach and Breakthrough are for individuals
- Companies taking part in Launchpad & Incubate should nominate an individual who attends sessions
- We are particularly looking for applications from disabled people underrepresented in the sector, including:
 - ◆ Wheelchair users who can't work in spaces that aren't wheelchair accessible
 - ◆ People of the Global Majority
 - ◆ People from working class backgrounds
 - ◆ People who have caring responsibilities (including parents and guardians of young children)

Pay and Participation

- Both Reach and Launchpad involve active script work, compulsory meetings and workshops
- These programmes are designed around development *and* performance - they're not just about the chance to stage your work, and the development elements are essential for your work to be in the final residential / showcase
- Your application should show that you understand and are excited about this development
- Because you're expected to attend, you're paid to attend

These programmes entail work - and work should be paid

Applying to our programmes

- Applications are open until Friday 13 March at 5pm
- There are forms on the website for each programme
- You can also fill in a Word form, and email it to artists@cripticarts.org - these are also on the website
- You can also apply with a video (in English or BSL) or an audio recording
- We're not able to provide or fund individualised access support for applications, but have designed our application to be as accessible as possible to as many people as possible

Friendly Application Process

At CRIPtic Arts, we use a friendly application process designed to be accessible to as many disabled people as possible.

- Applications are assessed by a disabled panel, including neurodivergent assessors, and we do not expect neurotypical writing styles
- There is no penalty for spelling, grammar, structure, or communication differences
- If we need clarification on any of your answers we will contact you to request that
- We will clearly explain what our questions are looking for to help you answer them
